The company moved from their eff.



"One of the things I am particularly
proud of is that a lot of the artwork here

has been done by my oldest son, Zach. As you go through the firm you see his work everywhere. He is 19 years old and is at the Rhode Island School of Design and he produces a lot of work. We take what we like and frame it," said Mr Marshall adding with a laugh, "actually it become more like Zach's gallery. A lot of people who have seen the offices have said that we shouldn't practise law but just open an art gallery and charge admission."

The Rhode Island School of Design is a fine arts and design college located in Providence, Rhode Island Founded in 1877, the school consistently ranks as the number of different companies like Sun Life and the Monetary Authority. It had low ceilings and was very claustrophen-bic with small rooms. The whole structure had been concealed by various renovations over the years that had no cohesiveness at all. Then we started pealing the layers back. We put in brick walls and all the floors were either tile or carpet. We ripped that out and found these beautiful saircase lit by a wonderful chandeller. That staircase and chandelier was an inspiration for the whole section. We wanted to surprise people as they came up to the offices After walking in the door (off Reid Street) you come into a tradition space and then become more surprised the more you come in the more you come in the more you come in the more you get the surprised."

And her face went a bit sad because she thought she was losing the job and replied 'No'. Then I said 'You're hired'. We wanted someone with fresh ideas. I believe that her business was primarly residential and this has given her entry into office space. Who knew a lawyer could be so creative? But Tim also paints and has a really good eye and knows what he wants. It was a fun project — all of us enjoyed it. Mr Benevides, who worked on the project with fellow architect Richard Oldman, said "It is something different. They were looking for something different they were looking for something that was a little bit warmer and less sterile—sort of an American loft look. And oll the staff (in the law firm) took a great deal of intereat in it— for the first week a

look. And oil the staff (in the law firm) took a great deal of inter-eat in it — for the first week a lot of the staff hung around and wouldn't leave? Mr Benevides said that the design started in January of 2011 and construction began in June with the staff moving into the offices mid December "It

was a pretty aggressive time line And I have to say that

was a pretty aggressive time line And I have to say that Araujo Construction did a great job. In fact the whole team worked well." When they first went in to look at the building MT Benevides said the offices were "standard generic office apace that was done back in the 1960s". He explained: "There were low ceilings all the way through — that was the way office space used to be done Fairly mundane. "Tim wanted it to be very attractive and practical as well. We exposed the ceilings and the work with the electrican took a fair amount of time but was enjoyable."



Mrs Burke added: "It gives the room a very nice light feel where the staff can eat their lunch and he kids can come back and chill or do their homework. Carla is multi telented. This was a big team effort and is definitely one of the most interesting projects I have done."

Mrs Burke's husband, Michael from thegreenhousebermuda, did the lighting and said: "We

Mrs Burke's husband, Mirhael from thegreenhousebermuda, did the lighting and said. "We did not want a white, bright, setrile looking environment, thus the lighting is more subdued than in many after existing offices."

Mr Burke explained that he used super efficient LED lighting and fixtures with a rotro style design—modern and the historical—for the space which was snhanced by the use of subtle, warm white coloured lamping.

tle, warm white coloured lamping.
The Dome pendants used were high powered par 38 (36 WAPT) LED bulbs and very high powered BR par 40 lamps.
Track lights were used in the Penthause area and all sconces, bathroom lights, table lamps were outfitted with specific styles of LED to suit the purpose of the light fixture. All rooms, table lamps, track, spots, sign lights were all fitted with LED and the undercounter lighting used LED strip. The outdoor lighting will all be LED sconces and water resistant and even the existing light fixtures.

outdoor lighting will all be LED sconces and water resistant and even the existing light fixtures were retro fitted to LED, including the chandeller Mr Burke's company won, for the second year running, the 9th annual 2011 Bermudian Business Products & Service Award (Green Company). He said "I have been bringing in sustainable products for some time now and I went into LED lighting about two years ago I think we are opening people's eyes to the quality and precision of the product."

And by using LED lights it reduces the maintenence "The longsvity of the product means you do not have the number of bulb changes. Some of these large companies have someone to change bulbs full time. By the

Mr Burke was very keen to get away from fluorescente. The LEO lights have "a let more versatility than the regular fluorescent which are not pleasant". He said: "We had to put in more lights because we chese a warm light. They do not give you so much light so we had to augment it a little bit. But I love the ambience of having little lights. There were a few issues in that the people coning across from the previous environment ought hought it wasniright ecomportally with the skylight. And I believe Tim wanted to be green a possible—low energy and using reused items. Tim was there every step of the way."

The LED lights will reduce entrape.

ergy and using reused nemerical mass there every step of the way."

The LED lights will reduce entergy use and thus electrical costs by as much as 50 percent in many cases. They can last \$5,000 hours and more and are cool to the touch and thus don't raise the ambient temperature as they only lose 10 percent of their electrical energy to heat. Fluorescents meanwhile lose 70 percent of their electrical energy to heat and halogens and incandescents lose 90 percent to heat.

"Thus the air in the room, when fluorescents energy is heated up to the point where the AC units need to use up almost a third of their energy to cool air heated simply by lighting," said Mr Burke.
